Health inequalities are felt most directly by individuals and communities, but they also place a considerable burden on our health service.

When patients who have been historically marginalised from health services feel their unique life experiences are listened to by health professionals, they are more likely to engage, and their chances of a healthy life improved.

LGBTQ+ groups, homeless people, and immigrant communities are all examples of populations for whom mainstream health services have not always served well enough.

It is vital to provide staff with the knowledge, skills, and confidence to understand vulnerable patients, and how health inequalities can manifest differently in patients.

To further reduce health inequalities, this directory aligns with the **Core20PLUS5** approach, focusing on improving access and outcomes for the most disadvantaged and underserved groups in our community.

We are committed to ensuring that all patients, especially those in vulnerable or underserved populations, receive equitable, culturally sensitive, and tailored support.

<b>Cervical screening</b>  All women aged 25 to 64 are invited by letter to cervical screening to check the health of their cervix. Cervical screening used to be called a smear test. <b>Bowel screening</b>  Bowel cancer screening is a test you do at home that checks for signs of bowel cancer. It helps them from diagnosis to recovery. It aims to empower them to feel supported and
